### SECRETARY GENERAL'S MESSAGE

Year 2021-22, has been a year of convalescence for the IT & ITes industry employees, especially in terms of employees gradually returning to office sites and ease of covid fears etc. Since December 2021, it has been 3 steps forward and 2 steps backward when it comes to WFH to RTO – however, overall it has been a gradual and good progress till date.

According to ACI Worldwide, India accounted for the most real-time transactions in 2021. This was 6.5 times the transaction volumes for the USA, Canada, the UK, France, and Germany combined, and it is over three times that of China, which is second in the world. This has brought simultaneously whole lot of new challenges to the Police and common man as a whole - the growth in cyber crimes - more and more people are falling in to the net of cyber crimes - right from a common man to senior citizens to college students to IT employees - the list is endless, any one who uses a smartphone, any one who is using internet, are becoming victims of cyber crimes.

SCSC has been very proactively working with the IT Industry professionals and also with Cyberabad Cyber Crimes section simultaneously to bring in lot of research, processes and innovation – right from detection to identifying organized syndicates to any organized segments of the Cyber crimes perpetrators.

With this kind of proliferation of Cyber Crimes, the Police department has also ramped up huge numbers of Police personnel to Cyber Crimes and we have witnessed one of the highest ramp up of Police personnel in one department in a short span of just 3 to 4 months.

On it's part SCSC in collaboration with Cyberabad Police, Industry & Academia is setting up CoE – which would be one of it's kind in India - Telangana State Police Centre of excellence for Cyber Safety to support Enterprises, Citizens, Government and Law Enforcement agencies as a whole. This would become a very valuable institution to serve the society from & SCSC Cyberabad Police.

While this is only one part of the story, till Covid-19 was prevalent, SCSC has received excellent support from the IT & ITes Employees as well as from the industry. The Industry has whole heartedly supported almost every initiative of SCSC, employees support was even more overwhelming.

I would like to thank all the Office bearers, Executive Committee, Secretariat and all our member companies for extending fullest support to sustain all our initiatives and also take up new ones during the year.

#### **Report on the Financial Statements**

#### **DiLSeY - Cybercrimes Awareness Sessions**

There has been a 300% increase in cyber crimes globally and India stands third among top 20 cyber crime victims (FBI report - 2020). In keeping with our goals in creating a safer nation and a safe Hyderabad to begin with, DiLSeY(Digital Literacy to Secure Youth) was conceptualized and launched on 18th January 2021 and trained over 100 volunteers from IT/ITES sectors to enable them to sensitize the youth at schools and colleges.

Batch 1 trainers have successfully conducted DiLSeY sessions for over 12000 citizens spreading awareness on Cyber Bullying, Fake News, SmartPhone Addiction, Social Engineering Crimes (Financial Frauds), Safety Tips.

Feedback has been encouraging with more than 85% of them giving 5 out 5 for the sessions.




#### Cyber Crimes Safety Awareness Shortfilm Contest



# SAFETY AND SECURITY FORUM

## Security Heads Meeting was conducted on the 31st of March 2022.

CREDENTIAL APP was launched during this APP. Mr. Venkata Dinakar, Jt. Secretary of Safety & Security Forum, SCSC and Ms. Shilpavalli, DCP Madhapur explained the usage and benefits of the software Application to the participants present.

Mr Dinakar gave a background about why this was needed in the first place and how the software tool would benefit member organizations of SCSC..

- a) When any of the outsourced staff of the agencies either from Security or house keeping or catering or gardening area, if they commit any mistake or crime, companies can't take any action on the erred outsourced staff, as the person is not on their roles and the onus is on the vendor agency to take any action, apart from barring that person to enter their office. Very unlikely, even the agency would do any legal action or lodge a police complaint.
- b) Any of the erring employees of the outsourced agency staff, whether they are from the security back ground or House keeping staff or catering staff were, at the most asked to replace the erred staff by the vendor, but the same erred staff are joining some other company through some other vendor and this person may exhibit similar kind of mischief at the new site as well.
- c) There is no information sharing tool or knowledge sharing with all the member companies or within the agencies, about the erred staff of the vendors.
- d) This tool would be helpful for the vendor agencies to do check on this kind of erred staff based on Aadhar Card & mobile number entry This tool would give the agencies to verify and then proceed for further recruitment.
- e) As soon as any of the erring staff does any crime or mischief act, apart from asking the vendor staff to leave the organization, the erred staff member data will be entered in a database, with a SMS message to the erred staff member that affected person's name has been entered in the database.

This would ensure that there is a transparency from the agency's side to their staff and secondly, all the other information stored in the database, would be kept absolutely confidential and the only remark that would be made is "please check further".

Currently, this is going through test run and it would be formally launched to all the member organizations shortly.



Tactical Training program was conducted after a good gap of close to 2 years and the batch has received very good response from all corporate. This is the VIII batch conducted by SCSC along with Cyberabad Police and first batch in the year 2022.

- Tactical Training Batch VIII was conducted from 25th March, 2022 through 27th March, 2022 at Cyberabad Police Commissionerate premises.
- 104 members from 25 companies from IT corridor have participated.
- Valedictory event was conducted post the training period.
- All the participants were felicitated with participation certificates from Stephen Raveendra, IPS., Commissioner of Police.

## Awareness on Drug Abuse

Cyberabad Police organizes awareness campaign against drugs abuse -

### Anti- Drug committees formed at College level

The Covid-19 Pandemic has given rise to new issues & opportunities as well. While most of the staff have started working from home, children could not attend schools or colleges, most of the time sitting at home, has given rise to issues like Drug abuse. As they were sitting at home, felt isolated, with no social interaction, lead many people to loneliness and this has pushed youth to some undesirable habits like Drug addiction.

As most of them were confined to homes, the majority of the drug business has shifted to online - Social media groups and some of them to Dark Net.

Cyberabad Police Commissioner M.Stephen Raveendra during the month of March 2022 inaugurated the Anti-Drug Abuse Committees formed in schools and colleges of Madhapur Zone. Members of committees from 148 educational institutions were present.

Commissioner Of Police Cyberabad Shri Stephen Raveendra, IPS., has inaugurated an antidrug awareness campaign aimed at students of various education institutes like schools and colleges for drugs free campuses. All DCPs, Students from schools and colleges have attended the event.

Commissioner Said. that the initiative was started off with increasing no. of cases involving youth and following directions of senior police officials to reach out to the public and spread awareness about the ill-effects of drugs. CP has assured that the intention is not to put students caught in this drugs menace through punitive measures, but put them on counselling, guidance, parents involvement. Only if these measures wont help, then Cyberabad Police is committed to combat illicit drugs and determined to step up the fight. The approach of the Cyberabad Police comprises awareness and strict enforcement. He said that this mission is supported by the local public and the State government alike. During the campaign, they will use multiple posters and messages and these were shared to the public.

Anti Drugs committees with different stake holders are formed to eradicate the drugs menace. In each college Committee Principal, 1Teacher, 1Student, 1 Parent, 1 Counsellor, 1 Non faculty member will be there. Once this committee comes across any drug abuse, will identify them, take the help of counsellors & parents, put them on to counselling and inform police when necessary.

With an aim of bringing in more awareness against drug abuse and to dissuade people from using ganja and other drugs, the Cyberabad Police on a continous basis, would organise awareness programmes in Cyberabad, he added. He said there is a direct corelation between drugs abuse and crime rate.

## Drug addiction & Wide Ranging implications.

Police across the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate started creating roadside awareness programmes. With the participation of the community, police have organised various roadside awareness programmes. Every alternate day, Police are visiting localities in their jurisdiction and conducting the programme to wane away youth from bad habits. Carrying placards with message of effects of drug abuse, a few policemen and women visit the colonies and important junctions where they stand for a few minutes to drive the message. Wherever possible, local colony association members are being invited to participate. The aim is to bring in a change through our campaigns. Also we are informing the people of legal implications if they are caught with drugs.



Madhapur DCP Shilpavalli also said that this campaign will be spread to all across IT Corridor to all the IT & ITeS campuses, ITparks etc and idea is to ensure that youth are weaned away from the drugs completely.

## The first short film contest on drug abuse

The first short film contest on drug abuse was conducted during the month of April & on 23rd July, SCSC & Cyberabad Police Commissionerate, together have felicitated the winners of the Short Film contest on Drug Abuse. This Contest was conducted by SCSC along with Cyberabad Police Commissionerate, with a view to create an awareness among all sections of society, on the growing menace of drug abuse afflicting various sections of the society. Many young people responded to the theme and participated using their creativity.

Addressing the gathering, DCP Kalmesh Shingenawar, IPS said that "instead of preaching about Drug Abuse among all sections of society, this is an innovative way of attracting a story, wit and humour, which will attract the attention of all the sections of the society and I am happy to see the enthusiasm of the public in this initative."

Mr Krishna Yedula, Secretary General, SCSC said "SCSC has taken several initiatives since 2006 for the safety and security of the IT industry and the society. In order to create awareness, on drug abuse, SCSC has decided to conduct this contest and spread the message through short films in social media, public spaces like theatres, malls, schools, colleges etc. We are very happy for the kind of response we have received and more than 70 videos have been submitted. ## Sanghamitra - A new initiative to reach out to communities

The COVID outbreak confined people to homes, so women who are subjected to domestics violence can find a friend in "Sanghamitra". Sanghamitra will bridge the gap between victim and the police.

Women and children safety are the top most priority of the Telangana State govt. and the Telangana Police. Cyberabad Police are constantly looking for ways to offer help and service to women and children.

Due to work from home some women who are working from home are subjected to domestic abuse, cyber frauds etc. The main objective is Sanghamitra is to help women who are in need of any support from the available ecosystem.

### Brief about Margadarshak & Sanghamitra program:

Violence against women is a pervasive problem across the world, occurring in every culture and social group and its magnitude and effects are often multifold. It has devastating physical, emotional, financial and social effect on the person in distress, families and communities. Majority of cases of violence against women are never reported and often hidden from view because of the social stigma and the lack of a supportive environment.

To end the cycle of violence against women, Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC) and Cyberabad Police initiated the **Margadarshak & Sanghamitra** Programmes where volunteers are trained to help victims of violence and people in distress. These volunteers will be the first responders to those who are seeking help.

#### Knowledge sharing sessions: Aug 2022

In Aug 2022 a refresher knowledge sharing program was conducted to Margadarshaks and Sanghamitras to give latest updates in women safety and awareness on various laws.

By knowing 40 % calls of the Dial 100 are related to women facing domestic violence and cases pertaining to crime against women received through. In these challenging times, distressed woman needs a friend, an another woman who stands up for her. Sanghamitra will help proving safe environment for women.

Sanghamitra is similar to Margadarshak initiative. It will act as a bridge between Women, Police and law enforcing agencies. 'Sanghamitra' is a unique model and not found anywhere. It is an initiative to reach help in timely and appropriate manner where required. It is an attempt empower women to take their place in the society as equals.

Sangha of 'Sanghamitra means community and Mitra, a friend. As name suggests, it is a friend, who has been equipped with information and knowledge about the various aspects of the law, of redressal mechanism, process and procedures of seeking professional help. And has access to resources to help someone from their community 'sangh' in time of need/distress. She/he will act as the bridge between the community members and the Police as well as the various resources such as help lines, shelter homes, counsellors and others.

- A structured approach to bust some of the myths about Police and Policing.
- An initiative to have help reach in a timely and appropriate manner where required.

It is an initiative of SCSC Women's Forum. It will be focusing on women's safety, as a part of a larger outreach effort to connect with residential communities with the objective of creating awareness about the various citizen friendly programs and initiatives of the Police.

There are currently 8 SHE Shuttle services operating in the Cyberabad







SCSC (Society for Cyberabad Security Council), Cyberabad Police together in Collaboration with Dept of Women & Child Welfare, Govt of Telangana pledges to support the Educational needs for Covid Orphans who lost both parents during the pandemic.

These kids have lost their parents due to Covid in the pandemic and their future seems to be bleak and there is no support available to continue their education. While most of the students are being taken care of by the Dept of Women & Child Welfare, Govt of Telangana by accommodating them in various Residential Government Schools located in Districts.

There are 40 orphans in four Districts—Hyderabad, Ranga Reddy, Sanga Reddy, and Medchal. And most of them are studying in private schools. Seventeen orphans were awarded these cheques during the last year and this year the number is 10 kids, as balance kids have completed their PLus 2 / Intermediate during the year.

SCSC has been extending support to these four districts in collaboration with the Dept of Women & Child Welfare, since 2020-21. Speaking on the occasion, Sri Stephen Raveendra, IPS., CP, Cyberabad appreciated the gesture by SCSC in complementing the efforts of the Government and supporting the financial needs towards the education of these orphans. He also mentioned that the orphans and their family members can reach out to SCSC for any further help they would need in the future.

Mr. Krishna Yedula, General Secretary of SCSC said that SCSC has always been at the forefront to drive unique initiatives for the benefit of the larger society and that it has delivered many such initiatives during the pandemic. He further added that the decision to support the educational needs of orphan children has been the most satisfying one. ## Support to Health Care

Sri Syed Ali Murtaza Rizvi, IAS, Secretary, Health, Medical & Ey, Govt of Telangana addressed SCSC Members and Leaders from IT Industry on Health & Ey, Safety Precautions as companies gear up to open their gates for Return to Office. A play book for Return to workspaces was released on the occassion.

Telangana has witnessed a steep decline of Covid 19 cases and transmission levels are under control over the last few months and now the IT industry is getting prepared to reopen the gates to all their employees to return to office, in a phased manner.

Keeping this in mind, SCSC organized an interaction session with Sri Syed Ali Murtaza Rizvi, IAS, Secretary Department of Health, Medical; Family Welfare for the benefit of IT Industry at Cyberabad Police Commissioner's office, along with Dr Srinivas Gadala, Director of Public Health and Cyberabad Police Commissioner, Mr Stephen Raveendra IPS.

Speaking on the occasion Sri Syed Ali Murtaza Rizvi, IAS, Secretary Department of Health, Medical & Samp; Family welfare said "all through the pandemic, while taking all covid precautions, government employees have worked in physical work spaces in offices to render services. The same can be replicated very well across the IT industry and there is nothing to worry. He said innovation & Samp; collaborative efforts are the hallmark of the IT industry and this can take place very well only when people interact in person. He assured the IT industry that the government will take all measures to assist them in their endeavour to return to physical working spaces.

Dr Srinivas Rao Gadala, Director Public Health said that the government is taking all steps for vaccinating 100% of the states' eligible population by the end of December month. He allayed fears of the industry about spread of Omicron and said that though there are reports of this variant spreading faster, it is also reported that the symptoms are milder. He said the government is closely monitoring the Omicron cases and taking all steps to prevent spread within the state. He said that infrastructure in government hospitals has improved tremendously. Answering a query, he said there is there is no thought of imposing lockdowns and situation will be under control with all measures taken by government. Addressing a query from the industry, he said that precautions for Omicron continue to remain the same, viz., 100% vaccination, masking and physical distancing.

Mr Stephen Raveendra mentioned that police is more than geared up for the full reopening of the IT industry and he said that he wanted the IT industry to interact with Secretary Health, so that whatever questions they have in mind, they can talk to them – not only now, but hence forth too.





Mr Shashi Reddy, Director Qualcomm handed over 10 Ambulances to health department today and speaking on the occasion he said that Qualcomm, as part of its CSR activities, donated these 10 ambulances to health department. He said that all the senior management at Qualcomm has already started working from office and expecting other employees to return to office shortly.

Speaking on the occasion Mr Krishna Yedula, General Secretary SCSC said that IT industry was in fore front in helping the health care industry by pitching in help on various fronts and the industry has generously pitched in with beds, oxygen concentrators etc. Most of the IT / ITES companies have already gave the option of return to office to all its employees, however, it is purely voluntary from the employees side. What we hear from the IT Industry is that good percentage of employees want to return to office. More than 100 representatives from various companies have participated in this session today. He thanked Mr Shashi Reddy, Director Qualcomm for donating 10 Ambulances to health department to be deployed for public use. Mr Krishna thanked Veni Rao Foundation, Chirec School management for donating a bus to be used as Mobile Clinic and SCSC on its part has made all changes inside the bus to accommodate 3 beds with oxygen concentrators and other required items inside.

Mr Amarnath spoke about how the IT industry in Telangana has achieved the distinction of fastest growth rate across the country and it is even more vibrant than ever.





# An Interactive session on Impersonation frauds during hiring with IT Industry HR Heads : on 22nd July 2022

HR in the Digital world has been proactively adopting technology for most of their processes- from Hiring to onboarding to assessments to Background verification and conducting interviews.

This facilitated speedy turn around and helped a lot of processes to go online, helped organizations cut costs and improved the productivity of HR. With every opportunity of change and process improvement, there comes challenges-one of them being, impersonation in the talent acquisition process, bringing discredit to the process and organization paying a cost to this kind of integrity issues.

We, at SCSC, have taken proactive steps in the past for handling many issues concerning the industry would like to invite you for an interactive session with the Cyberabad Police commissionerate.

We would like to thank all the CXO & HR Heads who could make it despite heavy rains on 22nd July, for the interactive session on **Impersonation in hiring process**, at Cyberabad Commissionerate. Industry representatives expressed that this trend has grown to higher levels due to the Pandemic & after that - they had to rely on technology for screening candidates and this has given a rise to this menace and each one of them have shared the kinds of frauds that are taking place.

Addressing the gathering, DCP Kalmesh Shingenawar said that impersonation comes under cyber crime and it is high time that companies start addressing this issue and start bringing this to the cyber police.

Mr Krishna Yedula, Secretary General, SCSC said that SCSC has taken several initiatives since 2006 for the safety and security of the IT industry and SCSC is happy to join hands with Hysea & Nasscom to address the growing menace of fraudulent methods of seeking job in IT industry at various levels.

Ms Manisha Saboo, President Hysea said that Hyderabad city has an excellent eco system of police support and she is glad that another proactive step has been taken up by SCSC along with Cyberabad Police.

Addressing the occasion, **Commissioner of Police, Mr Stephen Raveendra** said fraudulent methods like impersonation, fake profiles etc adopted by the job seekers is worse than virus and this is spreading due to the industry's reluctance even to acknowledge the problem and seek the support of police. He said that the issues raised by the industry are serious crimes and come under section 419, 66 A & D of IT act & also section 420 of IPC. Suggested that




the industry should come forward and complain, so that the police can create a database of these fraudsters, see the pattern and find out whether there is an organised hand behind this kind of menace, so that if the big hands are caught, then it would see a reversal of this trend. He suggested that the industry should think it over and come back with a solid action plan and police are available to extend every support they require.

# BASIC LIFE SUPPORT TRAINING BY SCSC AND AIG HOSPITALS

The 43rd batch of Basic Life Support (BLS) was conducted on the 27th August by SCSC and AIG at the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate.

28 volunteers were trained as first responders as part of this training programme.

Few topics covered in the training were Basic Life Support, Triage, Collar Application, Active Bleeding Control (ABC), Fracture Management at site, Bandaging and splinting, Lifting and moving etc.

Traffic officials said every month about 25-30 persons die in hospitals while undergoing treatment for the injuries sustained in road accidents. This stresses the need for basic first aid including the skills and knowledge on how to observe and handle the injured at the accident site.
