

Report on the Financial Statements

Women's Forum



'AB BAS' event was an initiative of Society for Cyberabad Security Council in association with Art Life Events, a National Event organized in Hyderabad that focuses on women saying Now Enough to being Victimized.

This event aimed at giving out the message that 'Society and women need to stop victimizing the latter. Instead they should fight their unforgiving circumstances and come out winners.' Focus topics were - Women against Rape, Acid Attack and Fight for Rights.

Each category had a guest -

Women against Rape:

Ms. Asha Devi (Nirbhaya's Mother)

Women against Acid attacks:

Ms. Lakshmi Agarwal (Ms. Deepika Padukone is making a biopic on her life)

Women to Fight for Rights:

Ms. Lakshmi Narayan Tripathi (renowned LGBT activist)

The event aims at collectively raising voice against Victimization of Women. The event was a grand success with over 1000 participants including employees, students and the public forum who were inspired by the amazing address words of empowerment by the speakers.

Mr. Jagapathi Babu also lent his valuable presence on the occasion. Commissioner of Police Mr. V C Sajjanar, IPS., Cyberabad, Mr. Bharani Aroll spoke on the various initiatives of SCSC and shared the safety help line numbers with the audience.





MARGADARSHAK PROGRAM

Margadarshak is a flagship certification in SCSC's endeavor to make Cyberabad a safe place for women. To further strengthen this program, frequent refreshers are conducted to provide support and help when needed through the NGO partners, SHE teams, lawyers etc to refresh and update content and share knowledge from time to time.

60 trained Margadarshaks took part in the Refresher program held at the Cyberabad Commissionerate and shared their experiences. Followed by this, an Orientation program was held at the Rachakonda Commissionerate for existing Margadarshaks as well as interested participants. 75 members attended this program. Following the Orientation Program, Level 2 of the Margadarshak Program- a field trip was facilitated to bring in first hand knowledge of resources and get hand on training in handling cases related to women. The following centers are included in the field visits.

The 8th batch of Margadarshak Training took place on the 24th of August at the Rachakonda Commissionerate where 26 enthusiast trainees were certified after completing the 3 levels of training as prescribed for a Margadarshak.

The 9th batch of Margadarshak training was conducted on the 5th of July hosted by Franklin Templeton in its campus. 91 attendees from 16 organizations viz., Accenture, Aricent, Berkadia services, Cognizant, Franklin Templeton, Hyundai Mobis, Neuland Laboratories, NGA HR, Novartis, Qualcomm, Raytex, Synechron Technologies, TCS, United Technologies, Wipro, Zensar Technologies Ltd



The 9th batch of Margadarshak certification program was held on 26th Sept, 2019 at the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate. 46 Margadarshaks of Cognizant, Franklin Templeton, Wipro, TCS, United Technologies, Berkadia, NGAHR, Hyundai Mobis, Qualcomm and Raytex underwent a 3 months long training program which includes experiential visits to the She teams, Women's Police Station, Bharosa, Shelter homes and other helpline centers to help women in distress, were certified during this program.

Sri V.C.Sajjanar, IPS., Commissioner of Police, Cyberabad Police Commissionerate presided over the certification program and congratulated Margadarshaks on the successful completion of the program.

Till March 2020, 9 batches consisting of 500+ Margadarshaks were trained from 75 organizations.

PROJECT SAFE STAY

The Project Safe Stay Phase1 Audit was conducted in 4 major areas of Madhapur viz., behind Madhapur P.S, Ayyappa society road, near Image hospitals, 100 ft road and Gowlidoddi in Gachibowli. A total of 117 hostels were audited on the parameters of safety & security guidelines.

Phase 2 audit was held in July 2019 covering Gachibowli and Raidurgam.

WOMEN SAFETY SESSIONS

Women Safety Session was organized at Deloitte Campus with more than 200 attendees. Ms. Swati Lakra, IPS., shared the dais and interacted with the audience on Safety initiatives taken up for women in Telangana.

A self-defense session was organized for 150 female personnel of TCS who learnt the basics of martial arts to respond and act during an immediate panicky situation when faced alone.

Keeping in view of the day to day pressures over work and domestic obligations, a wellness session was organized for Margadarshaks, Traffic Volunteers and Police Personnel to unwind themselves in a yogic and scientific way to improve one's mental well-being and overall health. The session was conducted by Dr. Saravanan, a wellness coach and was attended by 200 members.





POSH MEETING

Society for Cyberabad Security Council (SCSC) partnered with US consulate to have an open dialogue with SCSC members and IT employees across Cyberabad on creating respectful workplaces, creating a safe and secure environment for women at workplace. This session helped in understanding the practices of the civil rights act of 1964 and the POSH act of 2013.

Commissioner of Police, Mr. Sajjanar, IPS., Cyberabad presided over and called on the different initiatives taken by SCSC on this front and urged organizations to come forward with formation of ICC committees and strong mechanisms to deal with complaints related to workplace harassment.

Ms. Merri Hanson, Director, Peninsula Mediation & ADR, Williamsburg, Virginia who is a principle mediator, trainer, conflict coach and organizational consultant and the director of Peninsula Mediation & ADR gave a keynote address on Seismic shift in society and the workplace, beginning of the Gender equal protection under law which emerged in the United States in Civil Rights Act of 1964, and comparative laws in India for workplace harassment.

- India's female labor force participation rate was 27% for women versus 96% for men 2015 (World Bank Database)
- The global economy would grow by approximately \$28 trillion by 2025 IF women participated in the economy to the same degree as men (Power of Purity, MGI, 2015)
- The participants opined that, these kinds of meetings be organized regularly so that it will make more impact on the Society.

1st Anniversary of Cyberabad Bharosa Centre

Cyberabad Police celebrated 1st year anniversary of BHAROSA Center located at District Area Hospital, Kondapur run by Cyberabad police.

On 15th October 2018, Sri V.C Sajjanar, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Cyberabad has inaugurated BHAROSA Center at District Area Hospital Kondapur.

The re-united families along with the police officers inaugurated the program by watering a growing plant symbolizing growth of a Happy Family. Smt C.Anasuya, Dy. Commissioner of Police, Women & Child Safety Wing, Cyberabad, spoke about the inception and objectives of Bharosa, Kondapur and thanked the NGO's, Alcoholism and drug de-addiction center in Hyderabad and SCSC Margadarshaks.

Sri V.C.Sajjanar, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Cyberabad congratulated the Bharosa team which has resolved about 350 cases related to marital disputes and thanked Alcoholic Anonymous - a drug de-addiction center and other support Centers for partnering with Bharosa to bring families together. He appreciated and thanked SCSC for the extended support for Bharosa, 6 She Shuttles, Margadarshak Program, ICC workshops and creating awareness on women's safety for about 3.5 working women in the IT and adjunct areas. He felicitated and congratulated the re-united couples through Bharosa Family & counselling center.

SCSC SHE Night Walk - Radiant Hyderabad

As part of SCSC's on going initiatives towards creating a very safe, secure and progressive ecosystem for employees of Cyberabad, especially women, the SCSC Women's Forum is happy to announce the launch of its latest initiative around the theme of creating a safer neighborhood where women can feel safe to move around during late hours. The initiative has been christened as RADIANT HYDERABAD and is being launched with a SHE Safe Night Walk at 7.30pm on Saturday, 8th February 2020 at Gachibowli Stadium.

The Walk has being conceived as a Night Walk symbolizing that Cyberabad is a safe place to walk around even during late hours and will be aimed at involving employees, their family members and citizens in general.

Swaraksha-Tech Mahindra

Basic Life Support (BLS) Training:

Traffic Training Institute (TTI) and Society for Cyberabad Security Council had conducted a training session to 10th and 11th Batch of traffic volunteers on 20th July and 3rd August 2019 morning at Care Hospital, Gachibowli, Cyberabad. Around 30 Volunteers from various IT Companies have participated in each session to acquire knowledge about Basic Life Support (BLS), First aid, and road safety measures. A practical demonstration of the whole procedure of rescue is shown to the volunteers to have a better experience at the time of volunteering. Shyam Sundar Reddy, SI TTI and 20 police officials have attended the BLS Training. These sessions give great exposure to volunteers and make them confident to serve better to society.

Forum Meet:

SCSC Traffic Forum's core team meeting was organized on 22. July. 2019 at Cyberabad Police Commissionerate. The core team volunteers who represent various IT companies and other organizations were nominated for the 'Planning Team'. The 'Traffic Forum planning team' was initiated by Traffic Forum leader, Mr. Venkat Tankasala. The planning team is divided into 4 significant verticals with 18 volunteers from the core team- i) Corporate outreach ii) Traffic volunteer coordinators iii) Communication iv) Redressal and Feedback.

First time-Traffic Volunteers:

While the bustling traffic is bothering citizens, SCSC Traffic Forum volunteer team is splendidly regulating the traffic at the main junctions in the peak hours of the day. Our Volunteers contribute their hours in resolving the traffic woes. Fifteen volunteers from Freyr have volunteered for the very first time in resolving the traffic, at Cyber Towers Junction on the 30th. July. 2019. Twenty volunteers from Synechron have volunteered at Biodiversity on 31. July. 2019 from 10:30am - 12:30pm.

Survey:

In order to study the patterns of traffic for a comprehensive solution, one of the initiatives taken up by Cyberabad Traffic Police is to identify the density of traffic Flow to various clusters in the IT corridor from across the city during peak hours. SCSC in association with Cyberabad Traffic Police designed an Online Survey Link to be shared with all employees of various organizations. The Online Survey intends to get the details of the Route, Timings, Mode of travel, etc. That is used by the IT/ITES Employees.

The data captured by this survey is intended to help Cyberabad Traffic to prepare a detailed Comprehensive Traffic Management Solution with Alternate Routes, improving public transport in heavy density routes.

All Cluster Head meet:

On 9th July 2019, all cluster heads meeting was arranged to create a pyramid for emergency communication flow in the presence of Mr. Krishna Yedula, Secretary, SCSC, Sri. Vijay Kumar, IPS, DCP, Traffic and Mr. Venkat Tankasala, Jt. Secretary – Traffic Forum, SCSC Staggered Timings, Bulk SMS, Alternate Route Maps, App and Social Media, etc.,

Society for Cyberabad Security Council in collaboration with Cyberabad Police has conducted a 30 hour non-stop Hackathon on Road Safety and Traffic Management on the 19th and 20th of October, 2019. The Hackathon started at 11.00 AM on 19th Oct and will ended at 5.00 PM on 20th October. About 30 teams comprising of 120 members have participated. Teams present were from diverse backgrounds viz. IT Professionals, IT companies, Start ups, Traffic volunteers, NGOs, and students from Hyderabad, Pune, Chandigarh, Bengaluru and other cities.

About the Hackathon: With the phenomenal growth in the IT Corridor, Traffic Management and allied issues pose a significant challenge with the existing resources. The Hackathon is designed to tap young minds to explore creative ideas for adoptable solutions for improving Road Safety and Traffic Management.


Walkathon

Security Head meeting

TACTICAL TRAINING WORKSHOP

SCSC, Safety and Security forum had conducted a four-day Tactical Training Workshop for 95+ Marshalls from 19 Organizations.

Day 1: Security heads were introduced to the agenda on Tactical training by Mr. Bharani Kumar Aroll. The workshop started with a brief explanation about the inspection procedure of two-wheeler and four-wheeler automobiles.

Day 2: A brief session about disarming of knife, pistol and stick was organized. These activities gave a hands-on experience to the security marshals who joined the session. Later, the bomb squad demonstrated the process of defusing the bomb.

Day 3: A brief session about firefighting skills was conducted where a practical demonstration of the whole procedure was explained. This activity kept the members engaged as they passed to comprehend the fundamentals of it. Later, Fire evacuation drill was organized for the Security marshals where a demonstration on the Fire Evacuation drill was conducted by the Fire Brigade Team

Day 4: An awareness session on Basic Life Support and Women's safety was organized by Maxcure Hospitals and She Teams. The fourday workshop has come to an end when all the security marshals were felicitated with the certificates for the workshop by Convener, SCSC Mr. Venkateshwar Rao, IPS, DCP, L&O and the forum leader Mr. B.V. Dinakar, Jt. Secretary, Safety and Security Forum.

The Cyberabad Police has taken up 'Nighanetram', a special drive for installation of community surveillance cameras along with the SCSC. In response to this, a few IT organizations, volunteers and individuals have donated approximately Rs. 1.23 cr to SCSC towards installation of new cameras and maintenance of the existing CCTV network under its Corporate Social Responsibility initiatives.

Police Commissioner Sri. VC Sajjanar, IPS said, "CCTV cameras help in solving cases in the shortest time. In just 13months, we have installed more than 1.5 lac. cameras and we need one lakh more to bring the entire Cyberabad under Nighanetram."

Mr. Krishna Yedula, General Secretary of SCSC, thanked the organizations and has requested the corporates to come forward and take part in Community Safety and Security and helping the police to establish a safe and secure city" CGI has partnered with SCSC in contributing 25.8 Lakh and to maintain 150 CCTV surveillance cameras in Cyberabad, a technology hub in Hyderabad, India which houses IT companies. Synchrony has donated CSR Funds of Rs.50 lakhs which has come as a major contribution a part from other companies. Thespeakerssharedtheirknowledgeondigitalsignatures, statistics oncyber-crimesinthe city, country and global incidents, offences and violations that take place at an individual, organizational and society level etc. A victim of online matrimonial frauds hared her experience on the process of how she was duped of a large sum of money which was later deciphered as a Nigerian fraud.

Special mention to Mr. Bharani Kumar Aroll who has taken special interest to promote Cyber Security awareness in the eco system; Mr. Rajesh Kumar IPS, DIG-Intelligence who gave deep insights on Cyber Crimes and the steps taken by the Telangana Govt in building up collaborations in effective implementation of CERT; and to all the participants who very actively participated in the discussions and had interesting questions to the Speakers.

As a part of SCSC, we create a lot of awareness sessions in various locations about Cyber security. Citizens can always reach out to Cyber Crime Police Station, Cyberabad incase of any similar situation.

Brief facts of the case are that on 10.08.2019 received a complaint from one of the Sr Branch Manager of a Nationalized Bank wherein he stated that on 09.08.2019 an amount of Rs.8,20,000/- was transferred into ICICI Bank account through RTGS by debiting from the Current Account held by one of the leading automobile showroom located in Hyderabad on the telephonic instructions of the person



who impersonated himself as the owner of an automobile showroom without receiving cheque. After speaking to the management of the car showroom from which the amount was debited, the staff of the bank realized that the call which they received is a fraudulent call received from a fraudster in the name of the management of car showroom. As such the management of the bank filed a complaint for taking legal action against the fraudster for cheating their bank to the tune of Rs.8.20.000/-



Modus Operandi of the Accused:

The accused A-1 is the master mind behind this crime, he collects the details of car showrooms from net and make enquiries about high end cars by calling their sales team by posing himself from a big company and shows interest in buying cars. After which he is collecting all the details from the sales team of car showrooms about their showroom owner name, bank name, on whose name bank account held, bank account number of car showroom etc. In regular course of their procedure, the car showroom sales teams are sending a cancelled cheque photograph in whats app to the buyers/fraudster in good faith by believing him as genuine customer.

The A-1 who collects the details of the management of car showroom and its bank account details call the concerned bank manager where the bank account of car showrooms is maintained and introduce himself as the owner of the car showroom. Further he informs the bank staff and made them to believe that their showroom is intending to deposit huge amount as Fixed Deposits in their bank. Once the bank staff is satisfied with the information furnished by the A-1/fraudster over phone, A-1 is instructing the concerned bank staff to transfer the amounts from car showroom account into the bank accounts maintained by him by saying that he is sending original cheque to the bank for debiting the amount.

Believing the words of A-1 the bank staff is transferring the amounts into the bank account provided by him in good faith without receiving cheque.

The Cyber Crime Police, Cyberabad arrested four member fraudster gang i.e., three Nigerians and a lady from Nagaland for committing fraud in the name of arranging job in abroad.

On suspicion, the Cyber Crime Police of Cyberabad Commissionerate enquired a Nigerian national on 26.08.2019 about his involvement in cyber crimes, but he was not involved in any present offences and he could not satisfactorily answer regarding his presence in Hyderabad, purpose of visit to India, the type of visa on which he travelled to India etc. He disclosed his name as Mr Valentine Kevin, age 40 years, N/o. Logos, Nigeria and came to India in the year 2014 on medical attendant visa and staying in India illegally after the expiry of the visa and assisting his counter parts in Nigeria who are committing Cyber crimes.

Since the said Mr Valentine Kevin of Nigeria is staying in India illegally and earlier participated in Cyber crimes along with Nigerian counterparts, he was deported to his country on 20.09.2019 by obtaining orders from the office of Bureau of Immigration, Hyderabad to prevent him further commission of Cyber Crime offences by him in India.

TYPES of cyber attacks Malicious domains

There are a considerable number of registered domains on the Internet that contain the terms: "coronavirus", "corona-virus", "covid19" and "covid-19". While some are legitimate websites, cyber criminals are creating thousands of new sites every day to carry out spam campaigns, phishing, spreading malware or to compromise Command and Control servers.

Malware

Cyber criminals are taking advantage of the wide spread global communications on the corona virus to mask their activities. Malware, spyware and Trojans have been found embedded in interactive corona virus maps and websites. Spam emails are also tricking users into clicking on links which download malware to their computers or mobile devices.

Ransomware

Hospitals, medical centers and public institutions are being targeted by cyber criminals for ransomware attacks – since they are overwhelmed with the health crisis and cannot afford to be locked out of their systems, the criminals believe they are likely to pay the ransom.

The ransomware can enter their systems through emails containing infected links or attachments, compromised employee credentials, or by exploiting a vulnerability in the system.





Recommendations and prevention tips

With an increasing number of countries encouraging citizens to stay, learn or work from home, now is the moment to focus on cyber security, whether it's for your self or your workplace. Keep your information safe Backup all your important files, and store them independently from your system (e.g. in the cloud, on an external drive); Always verify you are on acompany's legitimate website before entering login details or sensitive information.

- Check your Software and Systems
- Ensure you have the latest anti virus software installed on your computer and mobile devices;
- Secure email gate ways to thwart threats via spam;
- Strengthen your home network;
- Secure system administrations vulnerabilities that attackers could abuse;
- Disable third party or out dated components that could be used a sentry points;
- Download mobile applications or any other software from trusted platforms only;
- Perform regular health scans on your computers or mobile devices.
 Be vigilant
- Talk to your family-including children-about how to stay safe online;
- Regularly check and update the privacy settings on your social media accounts:
- Update your passwords and ensure they strong (a mix of uppercase, lowercase, numbers and special characters);
- Do not click on links or open attachments in emails which you were not expecting to receive, or come from an unknown sender. As always, if you believe you are the victim of a crime, alert your local police.
