The Sanghamitra Programme

This is the first structured outreach effort to connect with residential communities in the Cyberabad area. This comprises safety awareness sessions and the 'Sanghamitra' training program

'Sanghamitra' as the name suggests is a friend 'mitra' who has been equipped with information and knowledge about the various aspects of the law, of redressal mechanism, process and procedures of seeking professional help, has access to resources to help someone from their community 'sangh' in time of need/distress. She/he will act as the bridge between the community members and the Police as well as the various resources such as helplines, shelter homes, counselors and others

- effort to create awareness about the various avenues of help which are available for a victim
- a structured approach to bust some of the myths about Police and Policing
- an initiative to have help reach in a timely and appropriate manner where required
- an attempt to empower women to take their place in the society as equals
- a bridge between problems and solutions

a step towards building a better societal fabric

Why 'Sanghamitra'?

Violence against women and children continues to rise. Reports suggest that the perpetrators in most of the cases are people known to the victim.

Survivors endure the abuse as they are plagued with thoughts like;

- Who do I reach out to for help
- What can police do, it is a domestic matter and we should resolve it within the family
- · What if they put my husband in jail what will happen to the family dignity

People around them, neighbors etc., are also unsure of what to do if they are aware of something like this:

- Its their family matter, we should not interfere
- What can we do anyway
- Complaining may spoil the reputation of the society/community

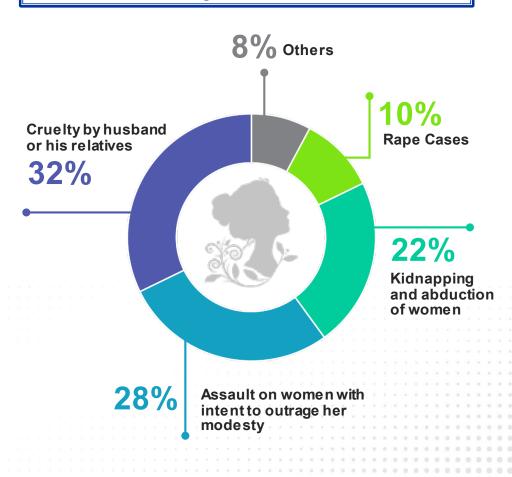
